Organisation details

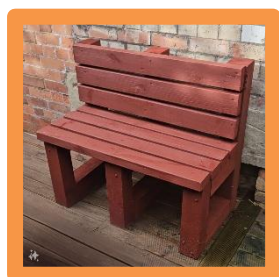
